Leadership Position Description

Troop Cheermaster

General Information

Type: Appointed by the Senior Patrol Leader with the approval of the Scoutmaster.

Term: 6 months

Reports to: Assistant Senior Patrol Leader and assigned Assistant Scoutmaster.

Description: The Troop Cheermaster is responsible for keeping Troop morale high. He leads the Troop in cheers, songs and yells during scouting events and at Troop meetings. He also is responsible for campfire programs. He encourages Scout Spirit in the Troop and encourages patrols to do patrol cheers.

Qualifications

Age: none

Rank: 1st class or above

Experience: None

Performance Requirements

Training: Meet with past Troop Cheermaster.

Attendance: As a leader in the Troop, regular participation is expected at Troop Leadership Committee meetings, weekly troop meetings, patrol meetings, special events and campouts.

Specific Leadership Responsibilities

- Attends Troop Leadership Committee meetings.
- Researches, proposes and prepares skits, songs and cheers for troop meetings and events.
- Leads the Troop in at least one song or yell during regular troop meetings.
- Plans, conducts, and/or ensures at least one campfire program at designated Troop campouts.
- Assigns roles for skits, arranges for props, supervises rehearsals.
- Coordinates Patrol duties at campfires.
- Works with patrols and patrol leaders to ensure that each patrol has a patrol cheer and a patrol flag.
- Works with SPL and ASPL to ensure that the Troop has a Troop cheer.
- Maintains selection of skits, songs and cheers.
- Works with younger Scouts to meet leadership and advancement goals.
- At the end of his term, passes all relevant records, material, information and advice to the newly appointed Cheermaster.

General Leadership Responsibilities

Uniform: Set the example by wearing your uniform correctly.

Behavior: Set a good example by living the Scout Oath and Law in your everyday life. Show Scout Spirit in everything you say and do.

Attendance: Set the example by being an active Scout. Be on-time for meetings and activities. You must call the Scoutmaster or Senior Patrol Leader if you are not going to be at a meeting or if you suddenly have to miss an outing in which you're required. You also need to make sure that someone will assume your responsibilities and is prepared.
